Applied Behavior Analysis · ABA is the science of behavior Change in environment to impact socially significant behavior Data • Function of the behavior · Skinner (the founder) Started in a lab with animals, but found that principles apply to all living organisms. DSG

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What is behavior?

 According to Johnston & Pennypacker (1993a), behavior is "that portion of an organism's interaction with its environment that is characterized by detectable displacement in space through time of some part of the organism and that results in a measurable change in at least one aspect of the environment."



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Excuse me?

• Simply stated, behavior is ANYTHING that a person does that can be observed and is measurable.

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Where it all goes wrong

- Too much of the behavior
- Not enough of the behavior



- Wrong place, wrong time, wrong people

All of these may indicate a skill deficit

Just kids behaving in ways that have worked to get their needs met.



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
Definitions matter



- Measurable
- Observable
- Describe exactly what you see
- Do not infer feelings of the individual
- An objective and measurable definition will help get accurate data, help determine the cause of the behavior, and ultimately help determine if behavior is improving.


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


- Behavior is maintained by the consequence, i.e., what happens right after the behavior occurs.
- Consequences have the power to increase a behavior or decrease a behavior.
- Consequences fall into 2 categories:
 - Reinforcement
 - Punishment






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
